

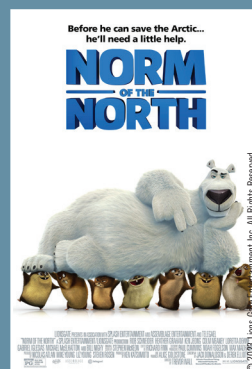
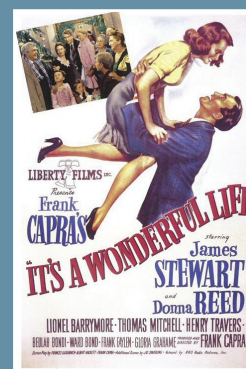

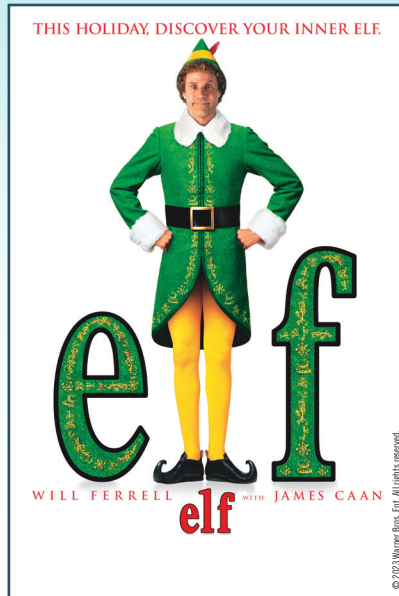

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Elf

*Event idea:*

Channel Buddy's love for the holidays and decorating into a Gingerbread House Decorating Contest! Have teachers and the principal serve as judges, and include different categories of winners like "Most Creative Use of Candy" and "Most Like Buddy."

*Event idea:*

This movie features a wonderful message of "no child left behind." You can have a suggested donation at the movie screening to raise funds for a local charity, or make the cost of admission a toy.



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**Dr. Seuss' How the Grinch Stole Christmas**

*Event idea:*

Get into the holiday spirit by crafting Grinch ornaments before the show. Simply paint the inside of a clear ornament green then glue pieces of a green feather boa on the top and draw, or attach pre-made, faces. Or, feature a Whoville photo op with props like Whoville hair, bow ties, the Grinch's smile, antlers and more.

*Event idea:*

Enhance your showing with a fun craft that can double as a gift for a loved one! Ideas include DIY keepsake ornaments, jewelry, bookmarks and coasters.

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**The Santa Clause**

*Event idea:*

Play Bingo-Ho-Ho during the screening. Include squares like “an elf appears” or “someone’s given a present” that students mark off once they occur on-screen. When someone has a bingo, have them ring a small bell so it’s less disruptive to those enjoying the film.

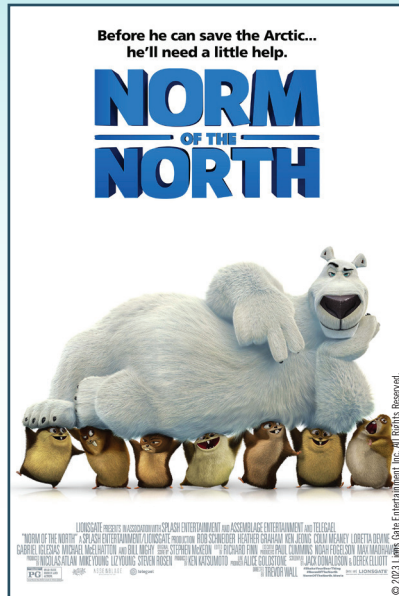


**It's a Wonderful Life**
